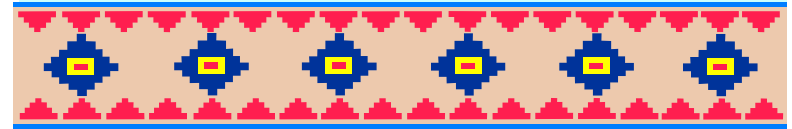


# Sierra Service Project
