## Tsaile-Wheatfields and Lukachukai Home Repairs

The Sierra Service Project (SSP) is a nonprofit organization committed to strengthening communities through service to others. Our services are provided free-of-charge to residents regardless of race, gender, disability, age or religion. SSP's home repair work is done by teenage and adult volunteers who are supervised by experienced paid staff. This will be SSP's fifth summer serving in Tsaile-Wheatfields and Lukachukai Chapters.

### SSP volunteers are able to do these kinds of projects:

- Building or repairing wheelchair ramps, stairs, porches, awnings, fences and sheds
- Painting (inside and outside)
- Roofing, floor and wall repair
- Insulation and weatherization
- SSP is not able to repair windows and doors or do any electrical or plumbing work.

After receiving a work request, an SSP employee will visit your home to evaluate the work requested. It is not possible to complete all requested work due to time, budget and volunteer limitations. A visit to your home does not guarantee that a project will be approved. SSP will do all work promised by this employee. The work will be scheduled between July 3 and August 11, 2017.

#### In order to receive our services you must:

- Complete a Home Repair Work Request
- Own your home
- We are unable to do any work within mobile home parks.
  - However, if you live in a mobile or modular home that is NOT within a park, you are welcome to apply for services.
- Your income must be at or below the qualifying levels found below:
