San Diego: Community Project Request

The Sierra Service Project (SSP) is a nonprofit organization committed to strengthening communities through service to others. SSP's home repair and community service work is done by teenage and adult volunteers who are supervised by experienced paid staff. This will be SSP's fourth summer serving in San Diego, but first serving in the South Bay.

Project List SSP teen volunteers are able to complete:

- **Facility repair** for local nonprofits, schools, churches or community buildings that benefit the entire community and not just individual families.
- **Community volunteering** like beach clean-up, dune restoration, community garden work, etc.
- **Home repairs for low-income homeowners** (*see separate home repair work request form.*)

After receiving a work request, an SSP employee will visit your site to evaluate the work requested. It is not possible to complete all requested work due to time, budget, and volunteer limitations. A visit to your site does not guarantee that a project will be approved. SSP will do all work promised by this employee. The work will be scheduled between July 2 and August 10, 2018.
