The Sierra Service Project (SSP) is a nonprofit organization committed to strengthening communities through service to others. Our services are provided **free-of-charge** to residents regardless of race, gender, disability, age, or religion. SSP's home repair work is done by **teenage and adult volunteers** who are supervised by experienced paid staff. This will be SSP's seventh summer serving in Tsaile, Wheatfields, and Lukachukai Chapters.

Project List SSP volunteers are able to complete:

- Building or repairing:
 - Wheelchair ramps
 - Stairs
 - Porches
 - Awnings
 - Wood sheds
 - Fences (wood only)
- Roofing, floor, and wall repair
- Painting (inside and outside)
- SSP is NOT able to repair windows, doors, or do any electrical or plumbing work.
- SSP is NOT able to paint homes that test positive for lead paint.

After receiving a **Home Repair Work Request**, an SSP employee will visit your home to evaluate the work requested. It is not possible to complete all requested work due to time, budget, and volunteer limitations. A visit to your home does not guarantee that a project will be approved. SSP will do all work promised by this employee. Work will be scheduled between **June 24 and August 2, 2019**.

In order to receive our services, you must:

- Complete a "Home Repair Work Request"
- Own your home
- We are unable to do any work within mobile home parks.
 - However, if you live in a mobile or modular home that is NOT within a park, you are welcome to apply for services.
- Your income must be at or below the qualifying levels found below:
